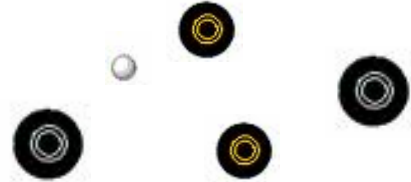

The Wonderful World of Ikea

It's no accident that the IKEA logo is blue and yellow—these are the colours of the Swedish flag. Founder Ingvar Kamprad was born in Sweden in 1926 and began his entrepreneurial career selling boxes of matches at the age of 5. Twenty years later he began the furniture company Ikea, where he explored furniture design, self assemble, advertising, the use of a catalogue, and a showroom to reach the many people of Sweden. Eventually Ikea grows into a place where people can buy coordinated furniture solutions for any room of the house. There are now 318 Ikea stores in 38 countries.



Having increased in popularity for its inexpensive furniture, Beyond Youth will be wandering the rabbit warren that is Ikea to see just what all the fuss is about! Accessible is a very low-cost café where you can buy your lunch, or alternatively bring your own. As we're taking a bus you might even be able to fit in a small purchase to bring home with you, depending on how many are traveling with us.

Robern Menz Chocolate Factory

The Robern companies had their origin in 1908 when Walter Sims opened the first of his grocery stores in North Unley. In 1926, he bought a dried fruit factory near Mildura to ensure reliable supplies of quality products for his customers. The Robern Dried Fruit Co continued to grow and expand under the direction of Edgar Sims. During the second World War, Robern was an important supplier of dried food to the allied forces.

In 1978 Robern entered the confectionery market when Grantley Sims bought the fruit bar manufacturing plant from Tandy Lifesavers. In 1992, Robern bought the Menz confectionery business when Arnott-Motteram-Menz was taken over by an American multinational company. The Menz tradition dates back to a small grocery and bakery business established in 1850. Their reputation for quality products grew rapidly as the company produced biscuits such as the famous Yo Yo and their confectionery and chocolate products, including Crown Mints (first made in 1892) and South Australia's own FruChocs. In 2003, Robern Menz bought the Medlow Fine Gels business, which had been established in McLaren Vale in 1995.

If you enjoyed a visit to Haigh's in 2010, come along and experience a tour of the Robern Menz facilities, taste testing their famous Fruchocs (and other delightful products), and the chance to purchase tasty goodies at factory prices.

JamFactory exists to assist, train, guide, challenge, empower and promote craft practitioners. Since its establishment as a visionary initiative of the Dunstan Government in 1974, JamFactory has remained Australia's foremost centre for the development of craft and design. JamFactory has supported and helped launch the careers and work of many of Australia's leading craft practitioners. Its internationally recognised studios, galleries and shops remain influential and inspirational centres for the crafts in Australia. Its name derives from the factory premises in which it was originally housed. In 1991 JamFactory relocated to a centrally located purpose-built facility at the Lion Arts Centre, a site shared with several other leading organisations including Craftsouth and the Experimental Art Foundation.


